# 15. 教学目标 Course Objectives

This course focuses on the Mongol empire, which, after its foundation under the famous Genghis Khan in 1206 AD, became the largest coherent land empire in world history. At the height of their power, the Mongols ruled over an area stretching from modern-day Korea to Poland and from Russia to Northern India. While they were feared by many, as emperors they proved to be tolerant and open, enforcing rigorous laws which - among other things - secured peaceful trade along the silk roads and thus a vivid exchange between East and West.

We will scrutinize the emergence of the Mongol empire and the factors contributing to its rise and fall. Further relevant topics, such as the capital Karakorum, the unsuccessful attempt to conquer Japan, the art of the Yuan-dynasty, the 'image' of the Mongols in Western sources and the role of Genghis Khan, will be addressed through case studies focusing on material culture.
